RECRUITMENT TO UCON NEEDS URGENT ATTENTION!



UCON: Ulipristal acetate versus conventional management of heavy menstrual bleeding
CI: Professor Hilary Critchley, University of Edinburgh

This Scottish led trial re-opened to Recruitment in October 2018 and all sites are urged to recruit again! Previous and new ones. Only 84 patients to go...... to complete the trial.

The European Medicines Agency (EMA) recommended research into use of ulipristal acetate (UPA). UCON is the only independent trial investigating use of UPA for HMB.

New Studies. Reminder!

The WILL Trial. When to Induce Labour to Limit risk in pregnancy hypertension – a multicentre, randomised controlled trial.

WILL aims to address optimal timing of delivery for women with chronic or gestational hypertension who reach term gestational age and are otherwise well.



This study was first circulated in the June Update.

The study team have now accepted all their sites for the pilot phase and they will begin communication with sites for the main phase at the end of the summer.

GBS3. The clinical and cost-effectiveness of testing for Group B Streptococcus: a cluster randomised trial with economic and acceptability evaluations.

Objectives: To test whether routine testing of women for GBS colonisation either in late pregnancy or during labour reduces the occurrence of early-onset neonatal sepsis, compared to the current risk factor based strategy.
