This paper presents findings from a national priority setting partnership exploring the questions and uncertainties that matter most to those living, working, and connected with care homes. Using a participatory approach, the study identified shared concerns across residents, relatives, and staff to inform the direction of future care home research and service improvement. The work offers a foundation for co-produced, evidence-based research priorities aligned with the lived experiences of care home communities. The ENRICH Scotland team carried out the Scottish data collection for this study.

This funding opportunity aims to support studies that assess how these services are implemented, their effectiveness, and their impact on health and social care outcomes. Research proposals should focus on areas such as service delivery models, integration with existing health and social care systems, patient and staff experiences, and cost-effectiveness.

Applications are encouraged from multidisciplinary teams, including those involving social care providers and service users.

ENRICH Scotland Update

In May, the ENRICH Scotland team came together for an in-person meeting to reflect on our engagement activities with care homes across the country. We discussed what is working well and where we can strengthen our approach, particularly in how we connect face-to-face with care home staff, residents, and relatives. These conversations are essential as we continue our shift from supporting care homes to become Research Ready to now supporting them to become Research Active and embedding research activity into everyday care home life. We are proud to report that we now have 435 Research Ready care homes in the ENRICH Scotland network. These care homes have demonstrated a strong commitment to supporting research and we look forward to continuing to build our relationships with their staff, residents and relatives in the future.

We also wish to extend a congratulations and share that Diane will be going on maternity leave in September. We are in the process of formalising arrangements to ensure continued support for care homes located within the region of Greater Glasgow and Clyde during her absence, and we will share further details in due course.

Looking ahead, our next in-person team meeting will take place in July, where we will continue to build on our learning and develop our plans for the year ahead.
