# Full Government response to the Lord O'Shaughnessy review into commercial clinical trials Updated 8 December 2023





This report sets the government's response in full. It provides an update on progress made against the initial commitments and provides a prioritised response on both the remaining recommendations and the existing programme of work announced in previous implementation plans. This document updates and supersedes previous plans.

The UK government welcome the areas highlighted in Lord O'Shaughnessy's review of commercial clinical trials, which has helped to prioritise key areas of the ongoing work to implement the bold and ambitious 10-year vision set out in Saving and Improving Lives: The Future of UK Clinical Research Delivery.

The <u>initial UK government response published in May</u> alongside the review, welcomed all recommendations from the review in principle, and made 5 headline commitments backed by up to £121 million. This was followed by a <u>full</u> government response to the review into commercial clinical trials in November.

Whilst the review focused on the systems and structures in England, many of the recommendations made in the review are applicable across all four nations of the UK as part of a collaborative, innovative cross-sector approach.
