

New streamlined notification scheme for lowest-risk clinical trials marks start of MHRA overhaul of regulation



The scheme will see the lowest-risk clinical trials processed by the MHRA in less than 14 days.

UK patients, the healthcare system and the life sciences sector are set to benefit from a new scheme that will see the time taken by the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) to approve the lowest-risk clinical trials reduced by more than 50%. The scheme is based on that outlined in the MHRA's <u>clinical trials consultation</u>. It forms a significant part of the regulator's <u>overhaul of the clinical trials regulation</u>, supporting the government's ambition for the UK to be one of the best countries in the world to conduct clinical research for patients and researchers.
